Welcome to Olomouc!

For the second time in history, the Czech Republic hosts the European Universities Championship in table tennis. The premiere round of this competition that took place in 2007 in Ostrava will be followed by already eight academic championship of European universities in Olomouc. This venue will be held from 20 through 25 June in the Olomouc Sports Hall of Palacký University.



In Olomouc will come together table tennis players – university students from all corners of Europe. The start list has been eventually stabilised at twenty men's and twelve women's teams. "I am very pleased by the interest from universities across the whole Europe. In the men's category we even had to reject further contestants" says Vít Ratajský, Chairman of the Commission of Table Tennis of the Czech Association of University Sports (ČAUS), unsuccessfully hiding his satisfaction over the number of participants.

The most numerous foreign expedition is coming from Poland where the university sport and table tennis in particular is extremely popular. In the Polish crew, we will find very famous names that belong to the core group of the Polish representation team. Olomouc will welcome for example Piotr Chodorski, Robert Floras, Pawel Fertikowski and Sandra Wabiková. Traditionally high quality is attributed to the university teams from Russia or Turkey. The long start list will not miss the holders of titles in singles from EUC 2015 in Geneva, Czech Michal Beneš and Anna Blazhko from Russia.
